

# ADR Certificate



Drivers (including those with a gross vehicle weight of 3.5 tonnes or less) are required by law to hold a Vocational Training Certificate, commonly known as an ADR Certificate, in order to transport dangerous goods.

The course equips drivers with information and tools so that they;

- Are aware of the hazards in the carriage of dangerous goods
- Can take steps to reduce the likelihood of an incident taking place
- Can take all necessary measures for their own safety and that of the public and the environment to limit the effects of any incident that does occur
- Have individual practical experience of the actions they will need to take

## Pass rate 85%

(based on figures from 2017)

On successful completion drivers will receive their ADR certification from SQA which is valid for 5 years.

This course has been approved by JAUPT to add up to 21 hours (or 28 with tankers) Driver CPC periodic training.
